DETAILS

PURPOSE

- train doctoral and postdoctoral students to give conference-like presentations;
- stay up-to-date with recent literature;
- work as a forum for students to socialise with the broader scientific community;
- and maybe, but not necessarily, to develop collaborations.

SOFTWARE

We implemented a team in MS Teams, which we use a lot here in Southampton. It has the advantage that it integrates video conferencing, shared folders (for article pdfs), a Wiki (for organising new references and information about the format), and many other tools (such as for polling). If you wish to participate, we add you to the team (you would need Microsoft Teams, but it is for free). Just let us know.

FORMAT

We would like presentations of articles to be in conference length (12min, max 15min) to:

- train PhD and postdoc students in giving conference presentations,
- to limit time and work load for both, preparation and meeting participation, and
- encourage questions and discussion about details.

Supplementary slides on details should be available to answer questions and for further discussion

TIME

At the moment, it takes place on **Thursday evenings at 17h**, because in that way:

- the meeting does not interfere with the course of the work day (especially for senior people/faculty staff),...
- research groups from the US as well as Germany can join despite the time difference, and...
- Some of us can stay longer for some online socialising.

FREQUENCY

The frequency depends on the number of volunteers. Ultimately, a weekly format seems to be desirable to have a reliable, recurrent event.
