How to access the system and record your module preferences



Accessing Online Option Choice - we recommend you use a desktop PC rather than a mobile device when using the system

- 1. Open an internet browser window (Internet Explorer, Firefox etc.) and go to: <u>www.sussed.soton.ac.uk</u>.
- 2. Log in using your University of Southampton username and password (the same details you use to access your PC and your email account)



3. Now click on My Student Record in the Quick Links box on the top left hand side of the page



4. You will now need to log in to the Student Record System with your University of Southampton username and password





3. The system will now check that you have met any pre or co-requisites. If you have not you will see an error message similar to the one below and will not be able to progress to the next screen

Confirmation and Comments

 If your selection meets the programme rules, you will be taken to the Confirmation and Comments screen where you will be able to see the optional courses you have selected and your reserve choices.


