Linking to YouTube video in Powerpoint

The most recent versions of **PowerPoint** for PC allow the embedding of **YouTube**, but if your version doesn't then:

1. copy an image from the video and paste it into your slide
2. copy **theYouTube** link and paste it into your slide below the image

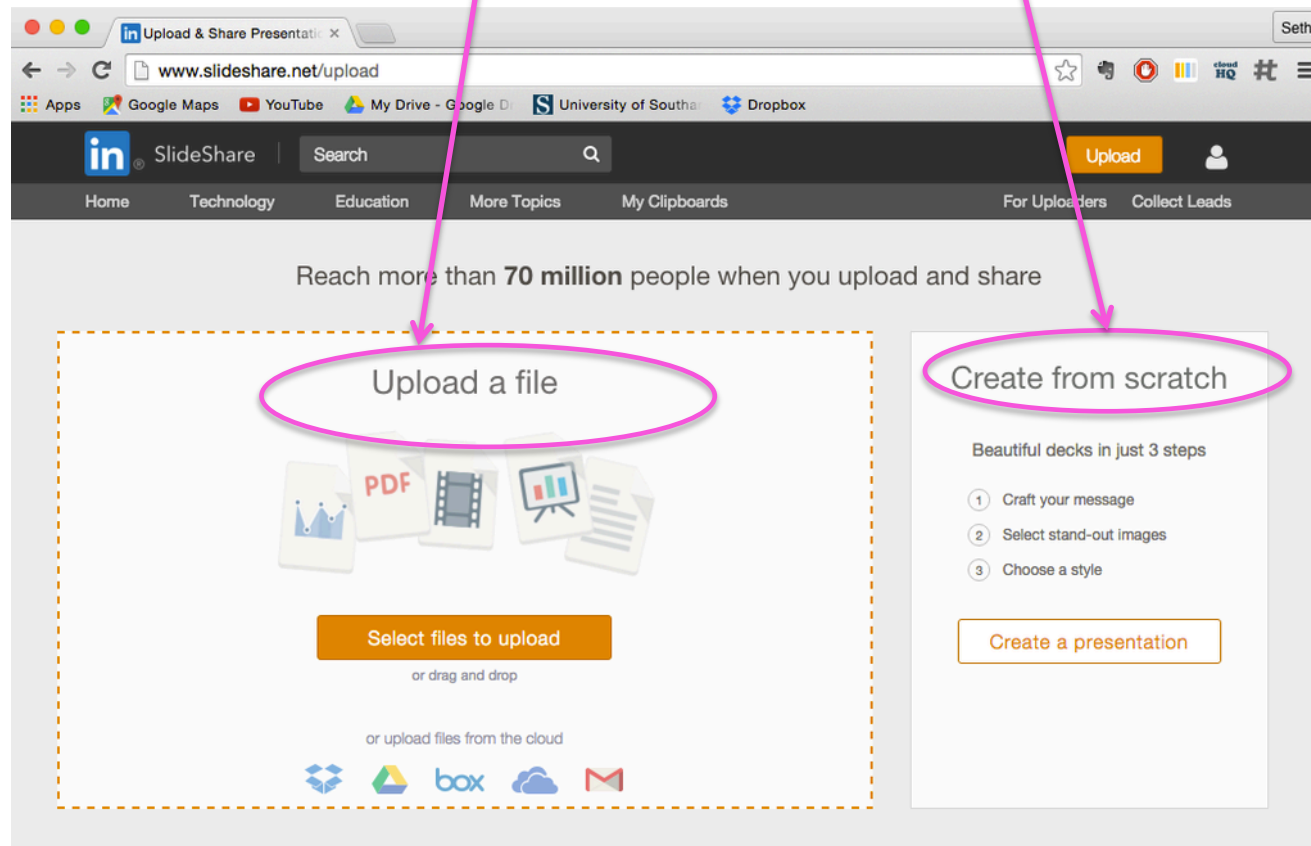


optional: you can make the image itself a link to **YouTube**

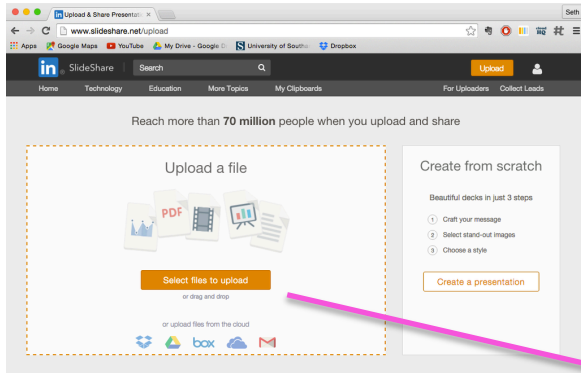
Using **Slideshare** with A. *linked* B. *embedded* YouTube video.
Register for a free account at <http://www.slideshare.net/>

A *linked*: Upload a slideshow you've already made in **Powerpoint**, **PDF**, etc. (if you use **Keynote** you'll need to save it as a **PDF**)

B *embedded*: Either Upload your presentation *without* a video slide Or: 'Create from scratch' and make your presentation in **Slideshare**

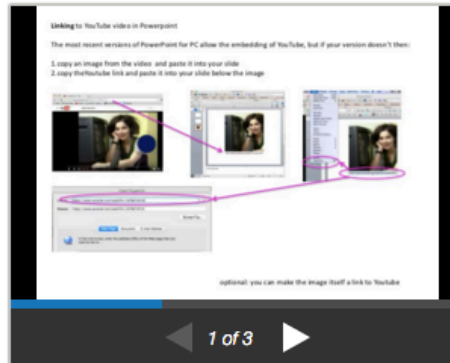


A. Using **Slideshare** with *linked* YouTube video.

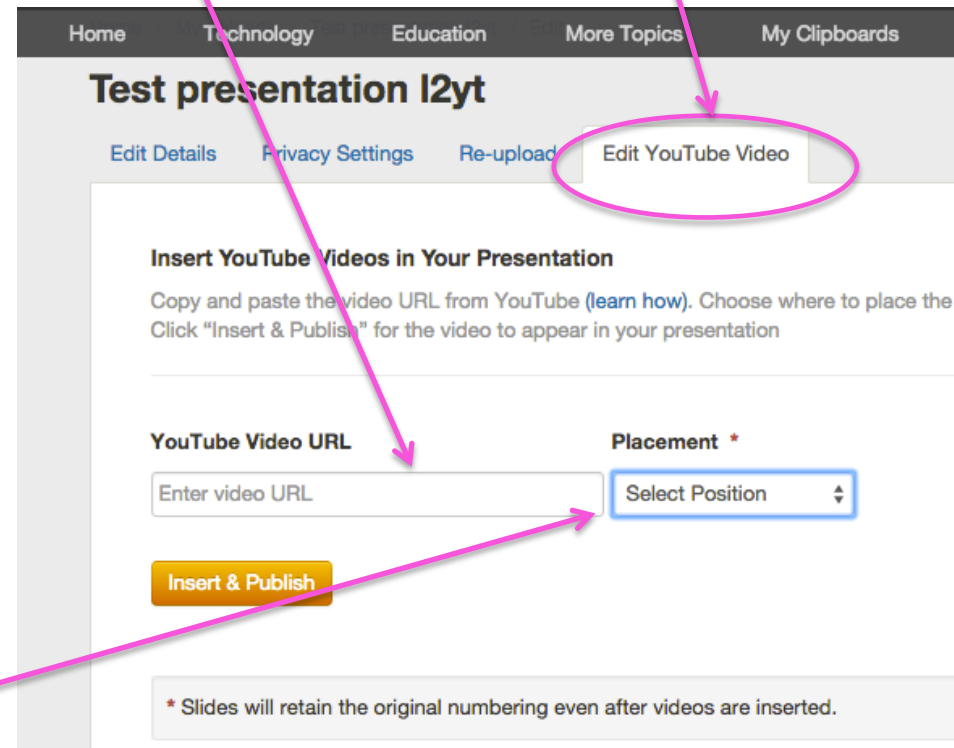


1. Click **Edit**:

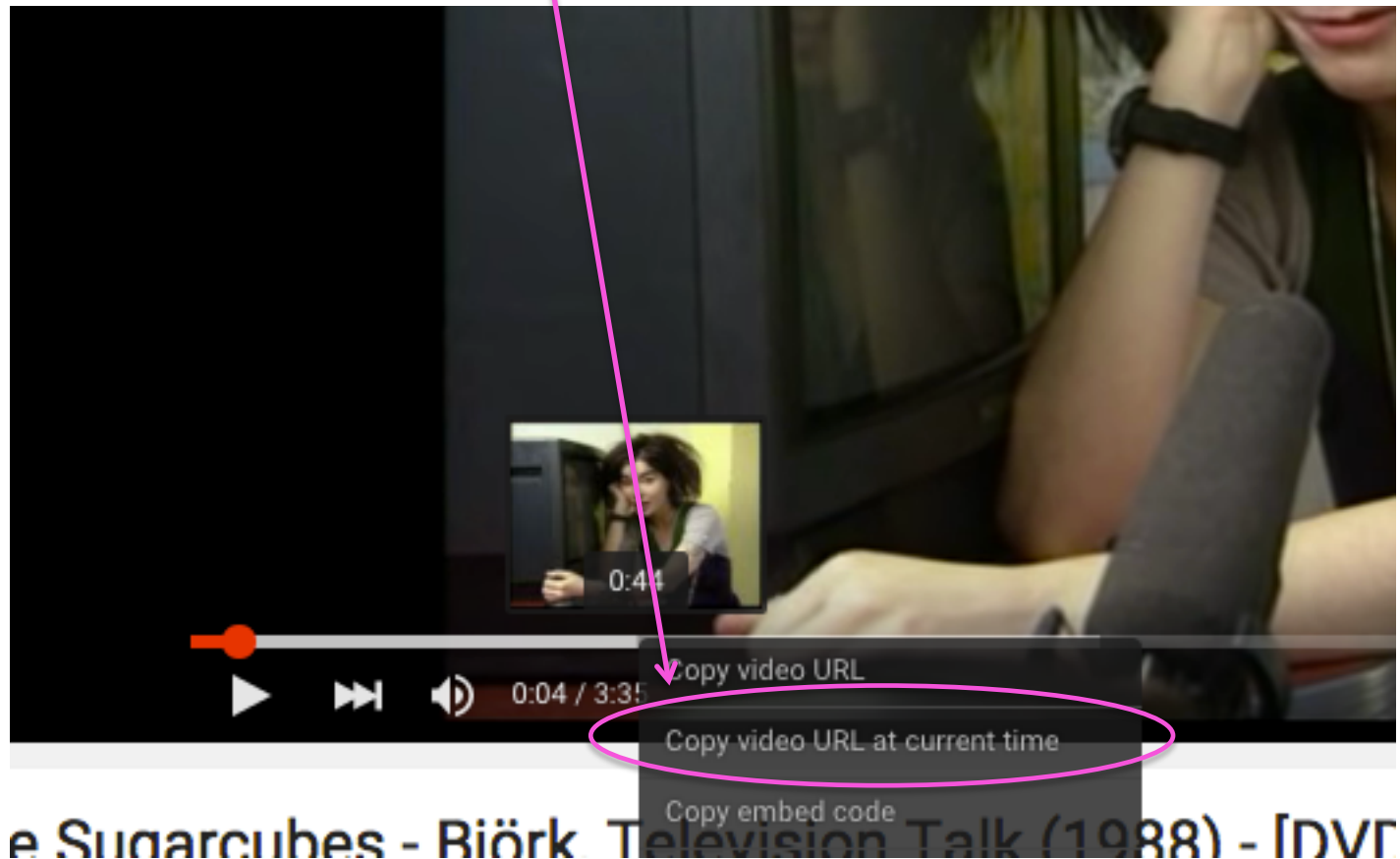
3. Choose where you want the video slide to go

2. Select the **Edit YouTube Video** tab

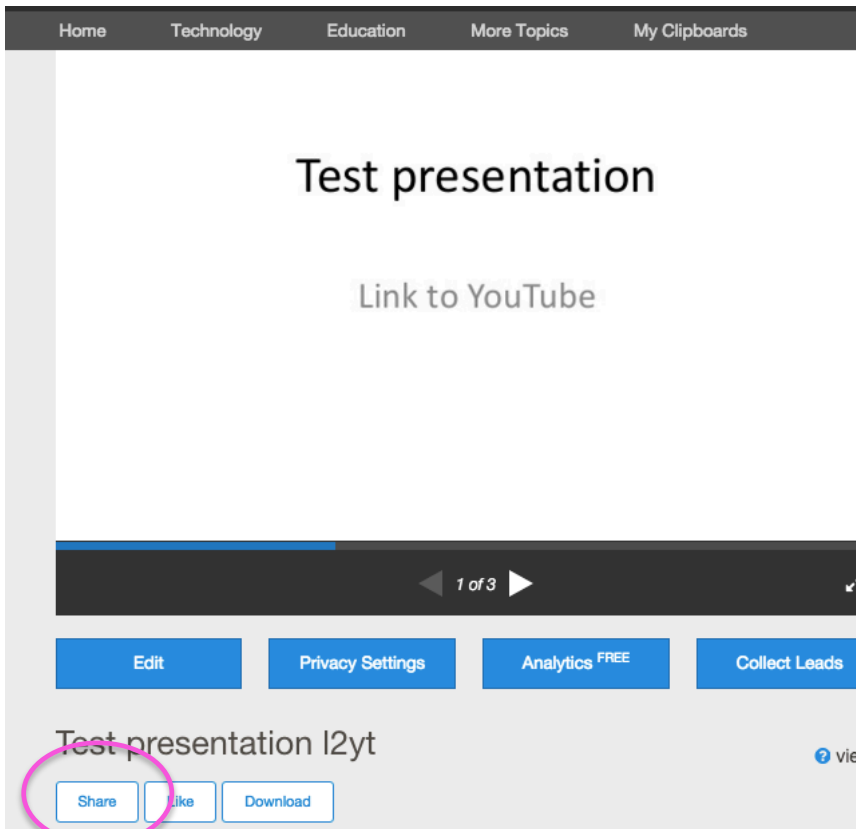
3. Paste the YouTube URL here:



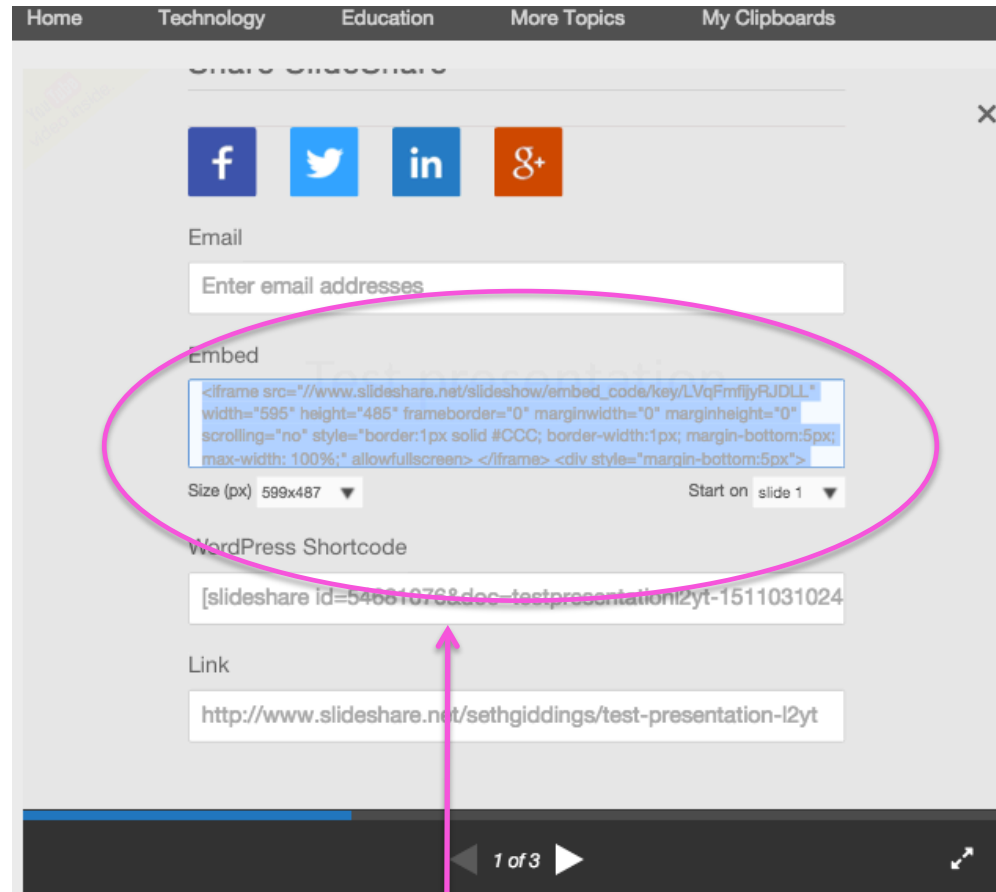
Remember you can link to a point on the **YouTube** video timeline, rather than the start of the video:



How to *embed* your **Slideshare** presentation in your **efolio** blog:



1. Select your presentation, scroll down, and click the **Share** button



2. Select and copy the **Embed** code

1. Now open your **efolio** blog and make a new Post:

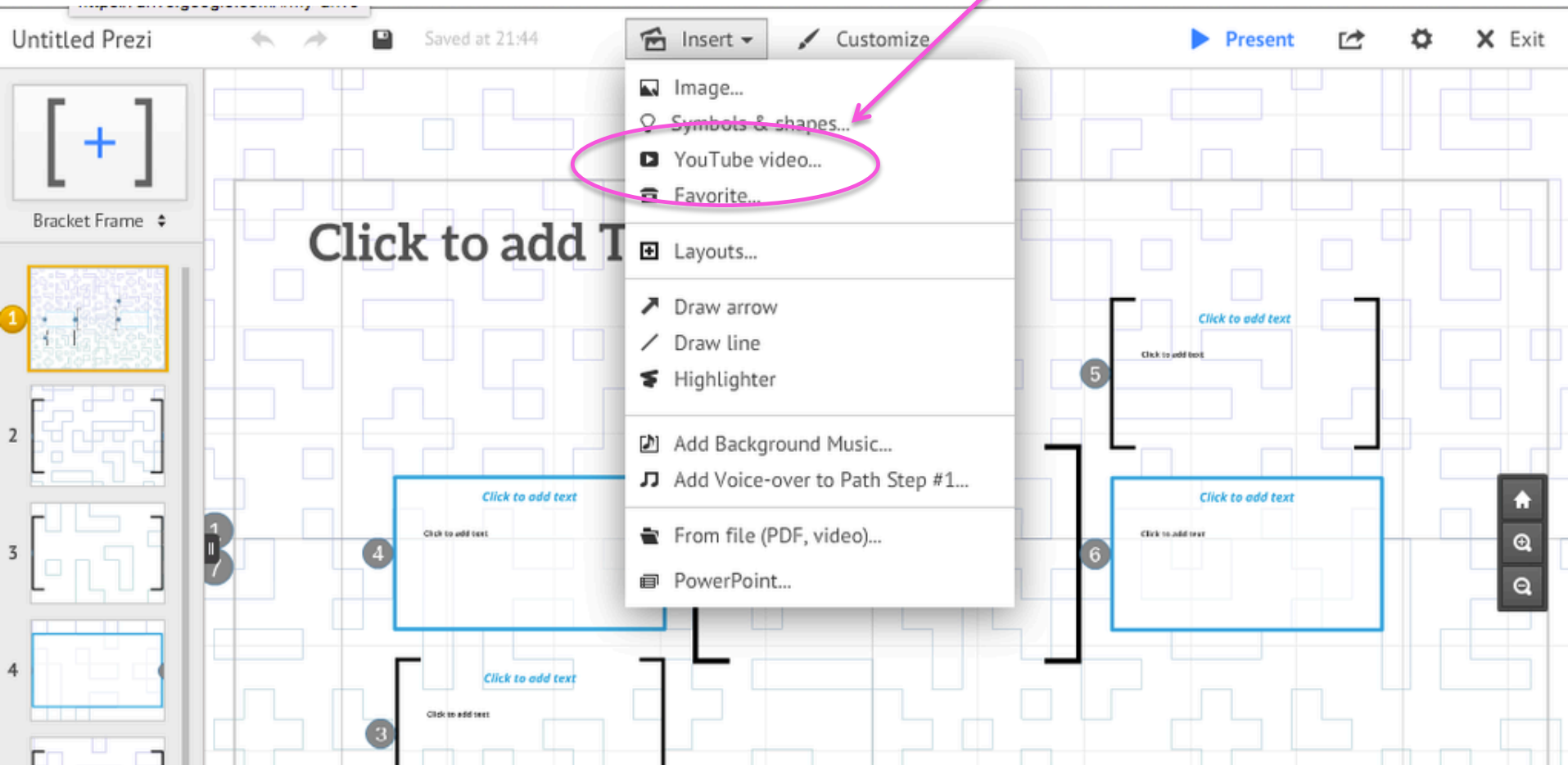

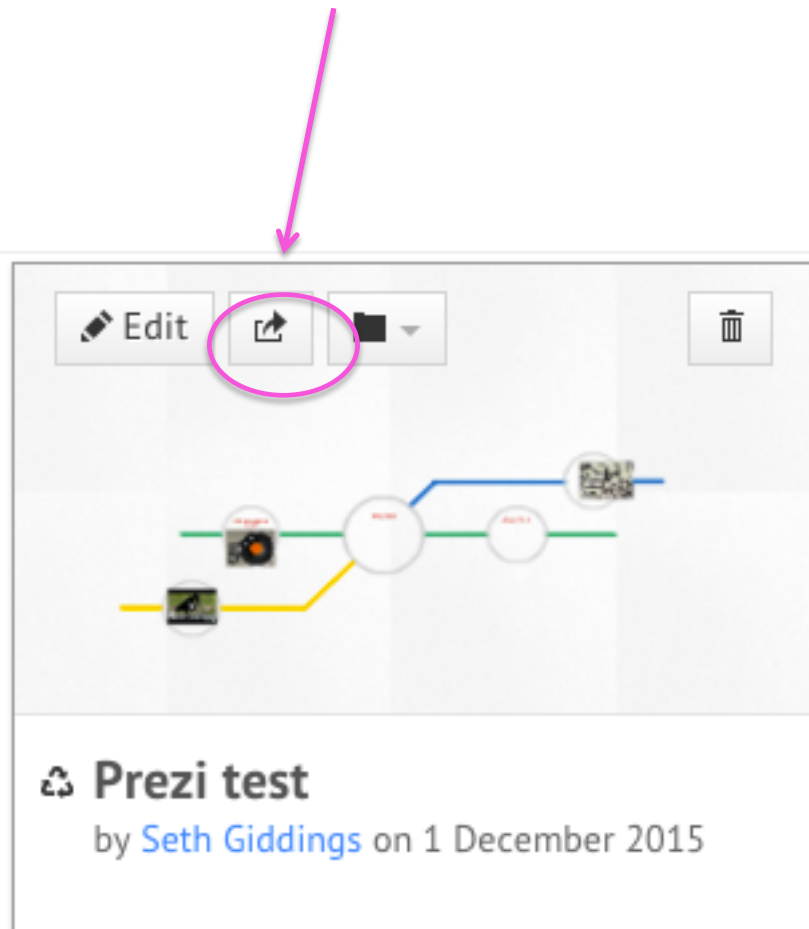

Alternatively you can make a **Prezi** presentation, and *embed* a **YouTube** video

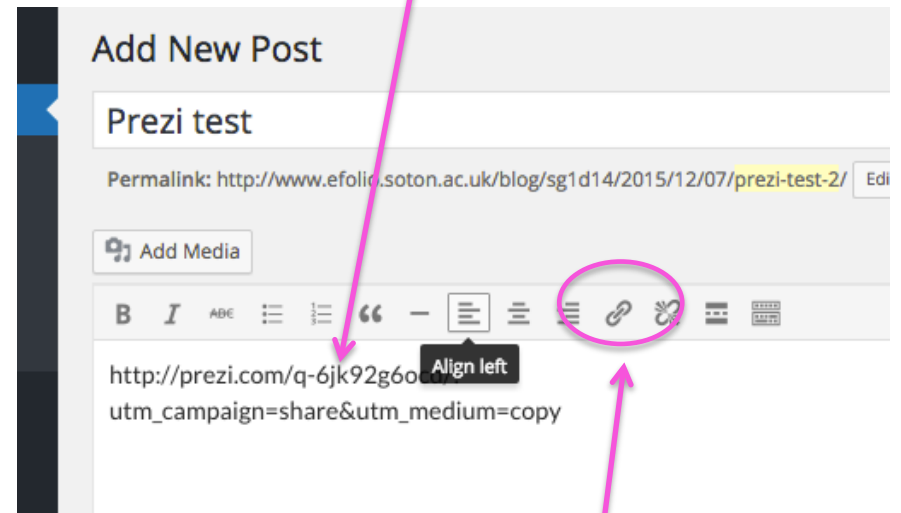


You can't embed a **Prezi** presentation in an **efolio** post, just its URL
