The John Hansard Gallery ([JHG](#)) are looking for engaging young creatives to be a part of our newly formed free [youth programme](#). Running between 2:30pm and 4:30pm. The group will run fortnightly alongside the upcoming [David Blandy](#) exhibition [Atomic Light](#). You will work as a team by responding to art and social issues to produce a collective outcome.



JHG Collective is a youth programme open to anyone aged 14-19. We are looking for enthusiastic young people who are willing to work as part of a team. To explore, participate in and deliver responses to our current exhibitions through conversation, making and questioning. Don't worry, you don't have to be good at art to join! As long as you are eager to share your ideas, learn and create we would love to hear from you.

During the peer led sessions inspired by the exhibition [Atomic Light](#) by [David Blandy](#), we will be asking you to respond in any form you wish to the exhibition. You might choose to draw, paint, film, animate, write or perform your responses. We will encourage our youth programme members to broaden their understanding of the creative industry. Delve into how we can respond and react to contemporary art exhibitions. The final view will be to create a public display in any form you decide as a group. It could be a workshop, performance, talk, activity sheet, film, conversation or exhibition. Whatever direction the group takes their ideas, we encourage teamwork, enthusiasm and a willingness to participate.
